I would like to encourage everyone to compile pictures and component lists on projects all year round and send them in... there is no such thing as too much Free PR!


Moving on, I want to be sure that everyone knows about the Buyer's Guide; it is changing form. No longer will the Buyer's

ittle did Phil & Rocio know how perfect their timing was when they came to New Energy Works and asked for a "small but perfect home". This request gave the team at New Energy Works plenty of inspiration as they thought about this project like a precious gem, which they eventually started calling the NEW Jewel.

Many of New Energy Works clients request smaller more sustainable homes because they simply don't need a bigger one. This reduction in square footage is smart for many reasons: less vacuuming, less heating and cooling, fewer taxes. And for many, less strain on the finances as they get to the point where retirement shines bright on the horizon.

New Energy Works began the design process with 1,000 square feet. Enough room for a pleasant common area, a couple of rooms for bed and work, a couple of bathrooms, as well as a mudroom and pantry. 



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

he Town and City of Verona make up a fast-growing area southwest of Madison, Wisconsin. It is an ideal area for a self-storage facility. Madison Verona Self-Storage is located along Highway 18, a busy throughfare with over 40,000 cars passing the facility each day. The land needed to have a zone change to allow self-storage. The township was receptive to this idea because the township wanted to maintain the land in the town and not have it annexed into the city of Madison. The two requirements were that the land could not be sub-divided and second, more importantly the land did not require city of Madison water and sewer connections. The final hurdle was to get the township's approval on the look of the project. The



township wanted to maintain the farming heritage of the area; therefore, the owner built the barn style office.

Madison Verona Self-Storage currently has 10 buildings, and when totally built out will have 19 buildings for over 135,000 square feet. The facility has conventional driveup units plus drive-up climate-controlled and larger Boat/RV sized units. The barn style self-storage office has a welcoming interior for customers to rent a storage unit. The facility is renting faster than projections and should be completely built out by 2024.



McAllister spent a lot of time researching other calf barns to design the perfect calf barn for the family operation. McAllister utilized resources through the Dairyland Initiative from the University of Wisconsin, feed company Vita Plus and their nutrition consultant, Jake Guenzler with Pro Agtive technologies to design and draft a highly efficient and spacious new calf barn.

"Basically, we wanted to get all calves from day old to 5-6 months all under one roof to better utilize labor and workflow," said McAllister. "The design allows us to eliminate dealing with the elements while not sacrificing the space, ventilation, and nutrition the calves need to grow and be healthy to become to the next generation of cows in the herd."

One of the more unique features of the barn is the calf kitchen where formula is prepared onsite and then delivered with the Milk Taxi. The efficient design also incorporated the grain auger delivering grain directly into the kitchen to remove the chore of hauling grain in and out of the elements. Each design choice was selected to maximize calf comfort and farm efficiency. This includes the roomy group pens, ample sunlight, natural fresh air ventilation and high efficiency OmniFount waterers from Ritchie Industries based in Conrad, IA.

The McAllister Dairy Farm's new calf barn is also a familiar backdrop to videos produced by Ted's fiancé, Megan Kregel, who has become a popular dairy advocate on social media. You can learn more about McAllister Farms on any social media platform by searching for megan\_dairygirl.

urtis Lemieux is at the helm of his successful family-owned and operated business of Econo Lumber and Econo Timber Mart in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan. Lemieux recently completely renovated his 70' x 70' hangar at Prince Albert Airport Glass Field. It's there that his Cessna Citation C510 Mustang makes its home and where Lemieux can depart on his plane for pleasure and business, or just hang back and enjoy his mancave, which is decked out with a pilot's lounge, a unique photo wall and a bathroom.

The renovation includes two Schweiss Doors hydraulic doors. The larger door measures 54' x 16'9" and includes four windows to take advantage of available light. The smaller adjacent door measures 13'3" x 8'11" and is used for a storage area where both hydraulic pumps are located out



The main Schweiss Doors hydraulic hangar door is 54 feet by 16 feet, 9 inches and an adjacent storage room/garage door measures 13 feet, 3 inches by 8 feet, 11 inches. Four well placed windows on the large hangar door and front hangar windows bring a large amount of natural light into the hangar.



An energy efficient "Big Ass Fan" is the answer to effective airflow solutions within the hangar. Two floor drains help to keep the hangar floor immaculate.

of view. Both doors are equipped with remote openers.

Lemieux decided on the Schweiss hydraulic door style because it was going to be mounted on an existing building and he needed the extra clearance for the tail of his Citation C510 Mustang.


Lemieux says, "Even if I didn't need the height, I prefer the mechanical simplicity of the hydraulic door. The quality of the door is excellent. I spray-foamed the inside of the door and put a white metal liner on the inside." The door was installed by Pineland Metal of Prince Albert.



This part of the hangar building is used as a storage area and garage. The hydraulic door is 13 feet, 3 inches by 8 feet, 11 inches. Both doors have their own remote openers. Notice the beveled concrete at the entrance that keeps rain from entering the garage and hangar.



Two aircraft windows in the bathroom are from a United 747 and now serve as mirrors.

Maintaining the simple, rectilinear gabled form and dark brown hue of the Woodin-





ville distillery, located 160 miles away (in Woodinville), the new complex's structures are clad in dark metal siding and Kebony modified wood. Large Corten-clad sliding barn doors and bands of Corten siding at key locations combine to evoke the warmth and character of the whiskey.

Selected materials were chosen for their aesthetics, durability, sustainability, ease of construction and connection to the materiality of the original distillery located in Woodinville, Washington. "Kebony was a natural choice for the front facades as the clients wanted the warmth of wood, but the material had to be durable enough to withstand the extreme heat and cold of eastern Washington's weather, without requiring continuous maintenance," Tillack said. "For us, it was a perect fit due to the beauty of the product, its sustainability and the ease of installation with the use of Kebony's rainscreen system."

The transition between office and process areas is demarcated with a long vertical window that folds from wall to ceiling,



In addition, the customer wanted a lounge attic space capable of holding a pool table. After gathering all of the customer ideas, Cedar Valley brought them all to life. The result was an exterior that matches the home and other shop on the property, but when you walk inside, it's a showroom.

The first 30' from the left is cathedral style ceilings to allow for several four post lifts for additional storage. The interior was designed specifically for ease of hanging storage cabinets and signs. With a steel wainscot, then transitioning to four feet of pre-painted 1' x 8' T&G pine, then finishing the last two feet in steel, the results are useful and versatile.



The stairs were pre-painted and designed with a custom onsite built cable railing leading to an upstairs attic space finished in drywall on all vertical walls, vinyl flooring and the same 1' x 8' T&G pine on the ceilings throughout the entire building.

The large 16' dormer was a bit of a challenge; due to the pool table, a beam had to be installed down the center of the floor



to support this weight if the pool table was ever moved to this location.

In the end, it is one of the most luxurious and beautiful buildings we have done. We're very pleased with all of our workers and subcontractors for taking the extra time to work with us and the customer very closely to bring this all together.


