




iemonds Independent Church located in Richfeld, Pennsylvania, first established in the late 1700s, built a new 15,000-square-foot nondenominational church facility, providing worship space, youth programs, and education, Bible studies, a food ministry and more.

The church is constructed with sustainable building materials including ABM panel metal wall sheeting used for siding, a drive-through porch with a metal soffit ceiling and an ABSeam panel charcoal colored, pre-finished, standing seam metal roof.

This area of Pennsylvania experiences much rain, snow, sleet, and hail with high winds regularly sweeping through. The church is located in a valley, which makes these weather conditions particularly challenging for any construction project. Mounted to its roof is the complete S-5! ColorGard snow retention system to protect churchgoers from ice and snow sliding off the roof.

n the vast tapestry of American architectural history, few styles evoke the nostalgic charm and rustic allure of the dogtrot house. Immortalized in literature, paintings, and photographs, this quintessential Southern dwelling embodies the essence of a bygone era, where the rhythms of rural life echoed through its open breezeways and expansive interiors.

Rooted in the vernacular architecture of the early 20th century, the dogtrot house has long been celebrated as a symbol of Southern heritage. Renowned authors like William Faulkner, in works such as *Absalom!* Absalom! and As I Lay Dying, imbued these humble abodes with profound social commentary, reflecting the complexities of Southern society. Similarly, Eudora Welty, through her lens as a photographer for the Farm Security Administration, captured the essence of the dogtrot house during the tumultuous 1930s.

Fast forward to the present day, where the spirit of the dogtrot finds new life in a recent project aptly named "The Dogtrot." Conceived as a modern interpretation of this iconic architectural form, our team embarked on a journey to blend tradition with innovation, paying homage to the past while embracing the demands of contemporary living.

When our client approached us with the vision of creating a cabin that reimagined the dogtrot concept, we recognized the opportunity to craft something





truly exceptional. The design called for a main cabin on one side, flanked by a two-bedroom guest cottage on the other, with a central dogtrot serving as both a functional breezeway and a symbolic link between past and present.

Central to the design concept was the incorporation of a clerestory that traversed all three spaces, suffusing the interiors with a soft, diffused light that seamlessly connected the disparate elements of the structure. Situated atop a mountain, the site offered breathtaking views that we sought to capture from every vantage point within the home. However, realizing this vision meant confronting challenges, chief among them the need to navigate the delicate balance between progress and preservation.

To make room for the footprint of the structure, several specimen oak trees had to be removed — a decision not taken lightly. Yet, in a testament to our commitment to sustainability and local craftsmanship, these trees were meticulously milled, kiln-dried, and repurposed as porch columns and decking, infusing the home with a sense of history and heritage.

Further echoing the ethos of sustainability, the project embraced the use of

locally sourced and reclaimed materials wherever possible. From the reclaimed brick cladding, the two-sided wood-burning fireplace, sourced from Richmond, Virginia, to the sleek modern gas fireplace clad in mill-finish steel, every element of the design spoke to a reverence for the past and a commitment to the future.

In the heart of the home, locally sourced soapstone countertops from the Alberene quarry in Schuyler served as both a functional surface and a tactile reminder of the region's natural beauty — a fitting homage to the rich geological heri-

tage of the area.

In "The Dogtrot," tradition and modernity converge in a harmonious synthesis, breathing new life into an age-old architectural typology. As we reflect on this project, we are reminded of the enduring power of design to transcend time and place, weaving together threads of history, culture, and innovation to create spaces that resonate with the soul.

In honoring the legacy of the dogtrot house, we pay homage not only to the past but also to the spirit of resilience and ingenuity that defines the American architectural landscape.







hen the congregation at Desert Rose Christian Fellowship in southern Arizona decided to move forward with building a meetinghouse, it made sense to go with a wood framed/metal exterior building due to a tight budget, durability in the harsh climate, and ease of construction. It was a great blessing to each one involved and the project was completed with 90-95% donated labor. All the work was done by the community except the drywall, floor polishing, and kitchen cabinet manufacturing.

Ground was broken in May 2023 and completion was in December 2023. The first day of framing was started with a bare slab at 6 a.m. and by 4 p.m. the last truss was on. Most of the work was done by approximately 15 volunteers with a workday almost every weekend. It was a long, grueling seven months, but looking back everyone can say it was a great experience







and it fostered a community spirit working closely together.






eing able to customize a structure for the needs of a building owner is one thing. The ability to customize it to the future needs of a customer is another matter altogether. Brent Benike is the general manager for Northern Farmers Co-op in Williams, Minnesota. Their organization had needed more fertilizer storage space for quite some time, but they wanted a building that could be expanded and modified based on future needs.

The changing nature of the farming business was one of the drivers for expanding the co-op's fertilizer situation. With equipment becoming more sophisticated, farmers can get their crops in the ground faster than ever (weather permitting). Consequently, fertilizer businesses have to be ready all the time. "You have to be at capacity to be able to handle that in today's ag world," said Benike. "Product has to be on hand so you can get it out the

door quickly."

Northern Farmers Co-op had an old elevator that it tore down to expand its fertilizer capacity, and they came to Legacy Building Solutions to design a new tension fabric building that fit on the company's land, which is hemmed in by a railroad on one side and a state highway on the other. Fitting structures into existing spaces is business as usual for Legacy. The company customizes every building it creates by utilizing steel I-beam construction for the frame. High-strength PVC fabric cladding is used for the roof, sidewalls, and end walls.

Northern Farmers plans to eventually add a volumetric floor blender in the new building, so extra space was provided for that. The co-op also chose to use precast concrete walls to create bins inside the structure, something Legacy often recommends. While the railroad and the highway prevent the new building from being



wider, its length could be expanded. An old Quonset hut is almost ready to be torn down, and Benike plans to expand the building into that space. By communicating those expansion goals up front, it gave Legacy's engineering team the opportunity to design end walls that will accommodate that growth.


Fertilizer storage can be hard on steel. As Benike puts it, "Everything that fertilizer dust touches wants to corrode." Legacy offers a range of epoxy coatings for the steel frames. Northern Farmers Co-op opted for hot-dipped galvanized steel frames, plus an interior fabric liner that seals the frames off to prevent contact with fertilizer dust.

Benike said the cost of their new fertilizer structure was about half of what a traditional stick building would be. "We needed reasonably priced storage," he said. "We didn't feel like a traditional building was going to fit our budget."

The building is in a busy tourist area near northern Minnesota's Lake of the Woods, and Benike says he's gotten comments about how attractive the storage facility is. While conducting research, Benike visited Legacy's central Minnesota headquarters to see their range of fabric structures — from the steel manufacturing plant to the paint shop to the main offices. "It made us a believer pretty quickly," he said.

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
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
